Both Linda and I feel it is such an honor and a pleasure to be a part of this wonderful club. We are looking forward to the day we can say things are back to normal.

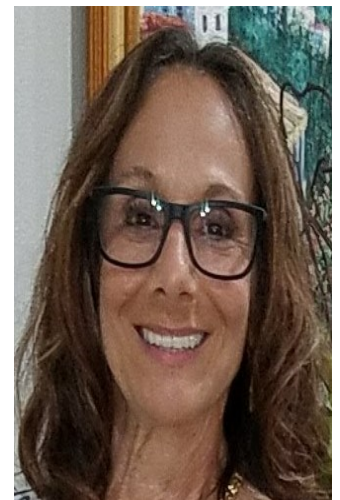

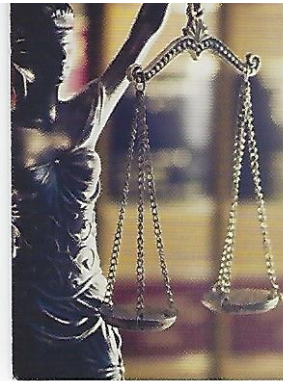
